Key knowledge:

Key Vocabulary and definitions

There are seven continents in the world – Asia, Antarctica, North America, South America, Europe, Africa and Australia. Asia is the largest continent and Australia is the smallest continent. I can locate Mount Everest and Mount Kilimanjaro on a map. Everest is located in Nepal. Kilimanjaro is located in Tanzania. The River Nile, Amazon and Yangzte are the three longest rivers in the world. They are located in Egypt, South America and China.

1. **Country** - places controlled by a single government. They can be big or small.
2. **Continent** - a large solid area of land made up of different countries.
3. **Capital City** - a city where the government of that country is based.
4. **Human features** - things that have been built by people.
5. **Physical features** – natural things that would still be here if no people were around
6. **Comparison** - looking to see what is the same about two or more things.
