What key knowledge do I need to have before this unit?

- When we say and write colours as adjectives after the noun in French, the spelling changes to match the noun, whether it is singular or plural, masculine or feminine. Some colours like **orange**, **red**, **yellow** and **marron** never change. They stay the same for both singular or plural or masculine or feminine.
